Call to Order	The Mayor called the meeting to order at 9:38 am.
Additions & Approval of Agenda	6.2 Library Update – Councillor Wacko 6.3 Snape’s Hill and Pet Feces – Councillor Damota MOTION by Councillor Kelleher-Empey that the agenda for today’s meeting be approved with the above additions. CARRIED
Approval of Minutes	MOTION by Councillor Wacko that the minutes of the July 8, 2014 committee meeting be approved as presented. CARRIED
Business Arising	Councillor Nesbitt confirmed that Connaught Boulevards and Sports Fields were the two items to discuss at the next Greenspace Advisory Committee meeting. Councillor Damota requested that the Cabin Lake Dam be added to the next committee meeting agenda, and that information received from Parks Canada at the last intergovernmental forum be forwarded to Director of Operations Bruce Thompson for review.
Youth Hostel	Councillor Wacko raised concerns about the cost of water and sewer hook-up associated with the construction of a youth hostel in the Sleepy Hollow area. It was agreed that a review of existing infrastructure in the area would help assess potential costs.
Library Update	Peter Waterworth informed Council that Craig Lemiski, Site Superintendent for the library project, was leaving his employment with Delnor Construction.
Snape’s Hill and Pet Feces	Councillor Damota inquired about what was done to address the growing amount of pet feces around Snape’s Hill. Christine Nadon indicated that an ad was put in the local newspaper, in the utility bill newsletter and on the municipal website. Bylaw Enforcement Officers are aware of the situation and are keeping an eye on problematic areas. Responsible behaviour will be encouraged before offense tickets are issued.
Goals and Objectives – Service and Structure	Peter Waterworth reported to Council on the strategic purpose of the Service and Structure Review and how it fits in with other Council planning documents. Mr. Waterworth explained that the service profiles included in the report serve to qualify and quantify services and service levels, which should assist Council with budgeting

and policy making. Implementing the structural recommendations featured in the report, however, remains under the CAO's purview, as defined in the CAO Bylaw.

Mayor Ireland left the meeting at 10:45 am; Deputy Mayor Wall assumed chairmanship.

The group's concern rests with Council and Administration's roles in implementing significant changes to the organization's structure; community health is supported by organizational health, and significant decisions concerning the latter, however administrative in nature, should be made in collaboration between the CAO and Council.

Mr. Waterworth will reflect on how best to present the Service and Structure Review as an information document at the next regular meeting. Council will not endorse or approve the document, but will formally receive it for information with the purpose of establishing the document's relevance in the overall strategic direction for the Municipality.
